Board Meeting Notes

On October 10 the Board met and conducted the following business.

- Approved the minutes of the September 12 meeting.
- Heard the monthly report: Attendance 71.5%. Administrative hours 253. The majority of those were for the frozen berry delivery. Service hours 161.
- Accepted the Treasurer's September financial report with a correction in the project budget. Donations include: \$100 to the Emerald Empire Reading Council, \$250 to Food For Lane County, \$800 to Habitat For Humanity, \$400 to Helping Hands, \$100 to Mt. Pisgah for an Interpretive sign, \$100 to 1st Place Family Center, \$100 to Salvation Army, \$700 to Children's Miracle Network, \$1,000 to Doernbecher, \$200 to the PNW Foundation, \$500 to Eliminate and \$250 to the School Health Program.
- Voted to give Buck Rosselli's family a Board Thank You Award for their help during the last two highway cleanups.
- Accepted the proposed 2016-2017 budgets as rolling budgets which will be reviewed and changed, if necessary, throughout the year.
- Scheduled a Berry Committee meeting for October 28. @ the Sanders house starting at 8:30 a.m.
- Heard that the Highway Cleanup will continue as a project.
- Agreed to Ring Bells for the Salvation Army on December 10 and 17 at Market of Choice on 29th and Willamette and Bi Mart at 18th and Chambers. The Key Clubs will be asked to join us.
- Recommended that donations to organizations be given later in the year, after the berry sale money has come in. Donations that are time sensitive will be made as needed.

Board Thank You Award

Our club takes pride in **doing** service, not just raising money to give to organizations so they could give service. Cleaning up the Belt Line highway is one project we do not give money to other organizations to accomplish. Twice a year we pick up trash on the Belt Line from the railroad overpass to W. 11th. Unfortunately, as we get older it gets harder and harder to do the pickup. Buck Rosselli's wife Toni, daughter Jessica and granddaughter Clara have helped during the last two cleanup projects. Their help has kept the project going. You don't have to be a member to participate. All people participating in a Kiwanis project are covered by our insurance. For their service to us and the community the Board awarded them the "Pick Up" Board Thank You Award for the Month of October 2016.
